Improving care for patients with COPD and heart failure

Alfred Health is working to improve the integration of care for our chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and heart failure patients together with GPs and community services. We have established strong collaboration between a number of inpatient units and Emergency across Alfred Health, as well as the HARP services in the community. We have introduced standardised sets of evidence-based interventions that have been demonstrated to improve outcomes for these patients. These sets of interventions, called 'Care Bundles', have now been implemented across Alfred Health.

The bundles – the result of collaboration between General Medicine, Respiratory, Cardiology, Emergency, Aged Care Medicine and HARP – provide patients presenting with an exacerbation of COPD or heart failure with consistent, quality care regardless of how or where they are admitted. Patients are also provided with an Action Plan to initiate self-management in a timely way if they experience an exacerbation of symptoms, and are advised to see their GP for further management. A copy of this Action Plan will be sent to the patient's GP.

Better Care Victoria E-Referral project

Demand for outpatient services at Alfred Health is increasing. 231,188 patients were seen through Alfred Health outpatient clinics during 2014-15, and 160 referrals are currently received each day. The waitlists for appointments in high demand clinics such as Orthopaedics are growing by up to 1000 patients per year.

Alfred Health has received a grant from the Better Care Victoria Innovation fund to implement a 'whole of systems' approach to the management of outpatients. The project aims to:

- 1. Optimise health and wellbeing in the community for patients with non-urgent medical conditions who require specialist care input from a specialist outpatient clinic environment.
- 2. Provide timely access to outpatient services for all appropriate outpatient referrals
- 3. Improve workflow processes to facilitate prompt and appropriate management of new referrals
- 4. Improve referral workflow to facilitate ease of making a referral for General Practitioners
- 5. Refine delivery of care to offer a broader scope of benefit to patients waiting on the non-urgent waitlist

One aspect of this exciting project will see us implement an integrated electronic referral system that will enable information to be securely sent electronically between health care providers. Additionally, referrals generated from within participating practices' software will embed clinical decision making support and referral guidelines within the referral template. Referring GPs will have immediate access to up to date guidance to ensure that patients referred are suitable and appropriately investigated when accepted onto the Alfred Health Specialist Clinic appointment wait list. This will enable the clinics to appropriately triage patients, with the aim to improve time to treatment for all patients on the waiting list.

Five local practices are participating in the pilot phase of the project, which aims to enable electronic referrals by September 2017 for these sites.

Practice tip: Radiotherapy for skin cancers

Radiotherapy plays an important role in the management of non-melanoma skin cancers, and can offer an alternative to surgical excision. This may be advantageous particularly in the elderly. Local control of skin cancer is as good as surgery in T1 and T2 lesions, and radiotherapy achieves good cosmetic and functional results.

Appointments can be arranged in a timely manner and there is no delay in treatment time.
