#### Interim medication charts for residential care patients

Medication errors commonly occur during transitions of care between health care services, including when care is transferred from a hospital to a residential care facility (RCF).

As part of a Department of Health and Human Services Workforce Innovation Grant, Alfred Health are undertaking a project to provide a seven-day interim residential care medication administration chart (IRCMAC) for patients discharged from the General Medical Units at The Alfred and Sandringham, Emergency Short Stay Units and the sub-acute aged care wards at Caulfield Hospital to ten selected residential aged care facilities. The interim medication chart is prepared by the ward pharmacist in conjunction with the hospital medical team, and can be used by the residential care staff until the patient is reviewed by their usual GP. The ten residential care facilities included the study are Coppin House, Gary Smorgon House, Smorgon Nursing Home, Montefiore homes, Central Park, Elanora Nursing Home, Emmy Monash Aged Care, Abberfield Aged Care, Regis Sandringham (Seaside Manor), Menarock Aged Care Services and Rosehill Aged Care. The observational pre-intervention phase will begin in the next few weeks.

# The Alfred Child & Youth Mental Health Service

The Alfred Child & Youth Mental Health Service (CYMHS) offers a coordinated mental health service for young people and their families. GPs can refer for issues including:

- not wanting to go to school
- trouble controlling temper or tantrums
- potential or actual harm to self or others
- feeling sad, depressed, angry, stressed, or anxious
- feeling shy or withdrawn
- not getting along with family, friends or others
- bullying or being bullied
- difficulties with co-ordination, social skills, learning and attention and concentration
- difficulties with play, speech and language

- eating and sleeping problems
- feeling or acting suicidal
- unusual experiences such as hearing voices, seeing strange things, having beliefs that seem out of touch with reality
- mental health and alcohol or drug problems
- experience of trauma or abuse.

Services are available for people aged 0-25 living in the municipalities of Port Phillip, Stonnington and Glen Eira. Services are available for people aged 0-18 living in the municipalities of Bayside and Kingston.
