Outpatient improvement projects are underway

Alfred Health is committed to improving the ambulatory care provided for your patients. Two projects will be underway in the next year to improve our outpatient services:

- The Outpatients Demand Management project will implement an electronic referral
 management system as a platform to receive quality referrals and communicate with GPs,
 combined with the implementation of innovative models of care to address the needs of
 waiting patients. This approach will enable a systems approach to managing demand and
 improving appropriate access to outpatient services.
- 2. A telehealth project will further expand and enhance the utilisation of telemedicine to provide specialist consultations for patients in rural and remote areas.

These projects aim to enhance the efficiency of our outpatient services, facilitate referrals, improve communication with GPs and provide better patient experience and outcomes.

Integrating care for patients with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD)

Alfred Health is working to improve the integration of care for our chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) patients together with GPs and community services. We have established a strong collaboration between our inpatient units of General Medicine, Respiratory, Emergency and Aged Care Medicine across Alfred Health, and are using a standardised set of evidence-based interventions (Care Bundle) that has been demonstrated to improve outcomes for these patients. We aim to ensure that all patients with an exacerbation of COPD receive high quality care regardless of how they enter Alfred Health or the treating unit. We are now looking to establish best practice in supporting the GP care of patients following discharge and in the event of subsequent development of an exacerbation.

One component of this COPD Care Bundle is the creation of an electronic COPD Action Plan (for appropriate patients) during a patient's inpatient stay (similar to the Lung Foundation of Australia's plan). To complement the Action Plan, an Emergency Medication pack will also be provided to these patients. Patients will be given their COPD Action Plan to take home, and a copy will be sent to the patient's GP (along with the patients' discharge summary).

We hope to provide further information face to face during GP practice meetings: a representative from the COPD Model of Care Project Working Group can come to your practice meeting to provide further information. Dr Charles Varley retires from practice this month

After many years consulting at Caulfield Hospital, Dr Charles Varley will be retiring from practice this month. Please note that his clinic will not be taken over by another consultant, and referrals should be directed to an alternative specialist.

Modecate (Fluphenazine deconoate) to be discontinued

Modecate (fluphenazine deconoate) is an older first-generation long-acting injectable antipsychotic. It is currently available as 12.5mg/0.5mL, 25mg/mL and 50mg/2mL ampoules. Alfred Psychiatry has received notification that Bristol-Myers Squibb Australia Pty Ltd intends to discontinue the manufacture of Modecate. This is a worldwide withdrawal and supplies may be exhausted by March 2017.

The intended withdrawal of supply of Modecate follows the recent advice that Stelazine (trifluoperazine) another older first-generation oral antipsychotic medication is going out of supply in early 2017.

Patients with a diagnosis of Schizophrenia, Schizo-affective disorder or Bipolar disorder may be prescribed Modecate or Stelazine alone or in combination with other psychotropic medication and

managed in primary care. In the months ahead, they will require a changeover to alternative antipsychotic medication. This exposes the patients to risk of relapse of their mental health condition with emergence of rebound psychosis and/or withdrawal emergent tardive dyskinesia.

General Practitioners are advised to refer such patients residing in the Alfred psychiatry catchment for a primary mental health assessment in order to draw up an appropriate treatment plan involving cross over to alternative anti-psychotic regime. Referrals can be made by ringing
