MBS-billed clinics at Alfred Health

A number of outpatient clinics at Alfred Health are MBS-billed services. On the doctor's behalf, The Alfred will bulk bill the cost of the consultation through Medicare. There is no out of pocket expense to the patient.

MBS-billed services require a current referral – please provide a 12 month referral to see the specialist of your choice at the requested clinic.

It is a Medicare requirement that referrals must be addressed to a nominated specialist. To assist you in providing referrals to a named specialist, you can access a complete list of specialists attending Specialist Consulting clinics and the Heads of Unit here. Please note, from time to time, your patient may be seen by another specialist in that clinic, in order to expedite their treatment.

Save the date - The Alfred Allergy Symposium

The Allergy, Asthma & Clinical Immunology Service at The Alfred is the largest adult service of its kind in Australia, accepting referrals from across Victoria. GPs are invited to attend **The Alfred Allergy Symposium**, to be held on Saturday 18th March 2017, 8:30am – 4:00pm in the AMREP Seminar Room, Alfred Hospital.

The day will take the form of a workshop with a major focus on interactive case discussions of important allergic presentations, developed with GP input.

Topics will include: Aero-allergy, thunderstorm asthma, drug allergy, food allergy, paediatric allergy, anaphylaxis & venom allergy, allergic skin conditions, occupational & environmental allergy.

The convenors are A/Prof Mark Hew and Prof Robyn O'Hehir, and presenters include A/Prof Robert Stirling, Dr Celia Zubrinich, Dr Julian Bosco, Dr Ryan Hoy, Dr Sam Mehr, and Dr Joy Lee.

Advanced Musculoskeletal Physiotherapy Practice at the Alfred.

Advanced practice musculoskeletal physiotherapists (AMP) have been working in the Emergency, Orthopaedic and Neurosurgery Units at the Alfred since 2005. The following clinics operate at The Alfred:

- Osteoarthritis Hip Knee service (OAHKS)
- Neurosurgery and Orthopaedic physiotherapy screening clinics
- Neurosurgery (spinal) post-operative review clinic
- Primary contact within the Emergency Department (ED)
- ED soft tissue review clinic
- Post Arthroplasty Review (PAR) clinic.

Referral is made via usual channels to the specific units. Further triage may result in patient allocation to the physiotherapy service. All services are co-located within the specialist clinic where close liaison occurs with the medical unit. In the past 12 months (2015-2016) a total of 4251 patients were managed within the advanced musculoskeletal physiotherapy practice services.

Advanced musculoskeletal physiotherapists (AMP) have developed innovative ways of offering clinical services and have provided mentoring for more junior medical staff. They have excellent communication skills and work productively with the medical team and other allied health team members. At the Alfred, they must have at least 5 years of experience as a musculoskeletal physiotherapist, and have, or be working towards a Masters degree in musculoskeletal physiotherapy. All AMP's are required to undertake a competency based training and assessment program to be credentialed to work in these roles – this program includes additional training in radiology interpretation, differential diagnosis, pharmacology and pathology.

Research suggests that in terms of diagnostic accuracy, treatment effectiveness and economic costs, physiotherapists in AMP roles provide equal or better usual care when compared to medical practitioners (1, 2). At the Alfred we survey patients and general practitioners annually to gain feedback on our services and hence improve the quality of service provision. We attribute the success of the service to the high level of training that the physiotherapists receive and the collaborative model of care with the medical team.

The Alfred physiotherapy AMP team have led several Department of Health and Human Services funded projects implementing the Alfred AMP model of care into hospitals across Victoria and Australia and recently won the KoAwatea International Excellence in Health Improvement Award for 'Developing a flexible and sustainable workforce' for the project titled 'Working Above "PAR" with a Victorian State-Wide Initiative Introducing Physiotherapy Led Post Arthroplasty Review Services'
