Voluntary Assisted Dying: Alfred Health's approach

The Voluntary Assisted Dying Act 2017 came into effect on the 19th of June 2019. It allows a person in the late stages of advanced disease to take medication prescribed by a doctor that will bring about their death at a time they choose – often at home supported by family and friends.

Alfred Health's approach to Voluntary Assisted Dying is to partner with General Practitioners who, in the main, act as a patient's **coordinating medical practitioner**.

Alfred Health clinicians may act as **consulting medical practitioners**, when appropriate, providing expert opinion on a person's prognosis or capacity.

For inpatients who have approved access to Voluntary Assisted Dying medications, we will help to return them back to the comfort of their home, so they can use the medications at a time of their choosing.

Important information for GPs

- Prior to making a request for a consulting medical practitioner, please contact the GP Liaison Service on 9076 2620 to discuss the referral.
- After discussion with GP Liaison, a written referral should be faxed to The Alfred Health Specialist Clinics' central referral fax number on 9076 6938.
- GP Liaison will discuss each referral with the appropriate Head of Unit and keep the coordinating medical practitioner informed about the availability of consulting practitioners.

Heart Failure with Preserved Ejection Fraction Clinical Care Program

The Heart Failure with Preserved Ejection Fraction (HFPEF) Clinic is a comprehensive clinic to diagnose, evaluate and treat patients with HFPEF, previously known as diastolic heart failure. In view of the limited traditional treatment options available, this clinic provides a streamlined, structured assessment and confirmation of the diagnosis using echocardiography and gold standard exercise right heart catheterisation. The clinic is intrinsically linked to the internationally renowned research program led by Professor David Kaye, and patients are offered early access to breaking trials of new drugs and devices available. The clinic is designed to complement the care provided by the patient's general practitioner and cardiologist, working in concert to provide advice regarding evaluation and management.

Bariatric Surgery referrals to The Alfred

The Alfred Bariatric Surgical Service provides assessment, management and review of patients requiring surgical management of obesity. Surgical interventions include laparoscopic banding, sleeve gastrectomy and gastric bypass.

In accordance with the Department of Health's framework for bariatric surgery, patients being referred to the Alfred Health bariatric service program should:



- have a BMI>40 OR a BMI<35, with two or more significant obesityrelated co-morbidities eg hypertension requiring medication; type 2 diabetes mellitus; dyslipidaemia; obstructive sleep apnoea; pulmonary hypertension; obesity hypoventilation syndrome; and/or non-alcoholic fatty liver disease;
- be over 18 years of age at the time of referral;
- be younger than 65 years of age at the time of surgery;
- have attempted but not succeeded in achieving or maintaining clinically beneficial weight loss using non-surgical measures.

In addition to a referral, a completed <u>Bariatric Clinic Screening Assessment</u> form is required for referral to the service, and patients are required to participate in a health improvement and weight management program prior to receiving an outpatient appointment.
