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Caulfield Epilepsy Clinic



The Caulfield Epilepsy clinic is an outpatient service that offers comprehensive management for people with epilepsy. It is a multidisciplinary service comprising of Neurology Consultants Professor Terence O'Brien, Dr. Mark King, Dr. Sandra Petty and Dr. Anita Vinton, Epilepsy fellow's, neuropsychiatry and an Epilepsy nurse consultant.

The clinic is held on Wednesday afternoons in the main block, level 1 of Caulfield Hospital.

Investigations are able to be ordered during appointments and completed at the Alfred Hospital. These include; EEG, fMRI, MRI, PET, SPECT, and 5-day inpatient video EEG monitoring. We also have access to neuropsychiatry and a dietitian at the Alfred Epilepsy clinic which runs on Friday afternoons as well as the neurology research unit.

Caulfield Movement Disorders Clinic

The Alfred Movement Disorders service has expanded their busy Monday morning clinic to include a second clinic on a Tuesday afternoon at the Caulfield Hospital campus. This offers a comprehensive movement disorders diagnostic and management service for Parkinson's Disease, atypical parkinsonism, dystonia, choreatic and tremor disorders.

Five highly trained movement disorder specialist neurologists are involved in the service, with three neurologists and two fellows staffing the new Caulfield clinic weekly. Opening this second clinic has significantly increased access to specialised Parkinson's treatment for patients. All available advanced treatment options for Parkinson's disease are available through this service, including access to Deep Brain Stimulation surgery, Duodopa intestinal gel, and Apomorphine pump treatments, with nursing support in the clinic and over the phone. The service is active in teaching and research, improving access for patients to new treatment options for Parkinson's disease, and has particular expertise in Atypical parkinsonism including progressive supranuclear palsy and multiple system atrophy. They are able to provide review appointments to appropriate regional patients via telehealth, and accept requests for second opinions from across the state.
