Chronic pain management GP symposium



The Acute Pain service at Alfred Health are holding a GP symposium "Agendas surrounding the management of chronic pain in the community" on **Saturday 2nd December from 8am-5:00pm**. Topics include multidisciplinary management of back pain, weaning patients off complex multimodal analgesics, and managing opioids in the community.

The Alfred Emergency and Trauma Centre: some handy tips

- The ED admitting officer welcomes calls from GPs for advice and if patients are being sent to the Emergency and Trauma Centre. The direct telephone number for the Admitting Officer is 9076 2960.
 Please phone the AO for advice or prior to sending patients to Emergency and Trauma Centre.
- There can be a reluctance to administer analgesia when sending a patient to the ED; however, analgesia will never mask assessment of the cause and it is always appropriate to give at least paracetamol and/or ibuprofen (depending on the patient and suspected cause.)



- The Alfred Emergency and Trauma Centre is currently undergoing a major redevelopment with building works due to be completed in February 2018. Although this can affect waiting times and has impacted the area for new patients, we are trying as best we can to have 'business as usual.'
- Children are not routinely seen at The Alfred and should not be directed to The Alfred Emergency
 and Trauma Centre. Acutely unwell children should be referred to the Royal Children's Hospital or
 Monash Medical Centre, Clayton. If children are less unwell or need a procedure (including suturing
 and fracture management) they can be directed to the Sandringham Emergency Department. All
 Sandringham Emergency Consultants and Registrars are trained in the management of acute
 paediatric issues.
- The General Medicine unit has a dedicated phone number for GPs to call for direct access to a
 registrar to arrange admissions directly to the ward, or Medical Day Unit admissions for iron and
 blood transfusions etc. The hotline can also be utilised for complex care patients who are
 deteriorating in the community, not only for advice but also to link in with HARP services, outpatient
 clinics, home visits etc. The GP Hotline number is 0428 626 183.
- MATS (Mobile Assessment and Treatment Service) and GEM (Geriatric Evaluation and Management)
 <u>at Home</u> can organise appropriate patients to be assessed in residential care or at home, as an
 alternative to sending patients to the Emergency Department.
- If your patient already has an outpatient appointment but needs to be seen sooner (but is not acutely unwell), please contact the unit registrar via Switchboard on 9076 2000 to arrange an earlier review rather than sending the patient to the Emergency Department.

General Surgery clinic now at Caulfield Hospital

Ms Lara Freeman, General Surgeon, is commencing a clinic at Caulfield Hospital from November 21st. Ms Freeman currently consults at Sandringham, and provides general surgery consultation including hernias; skin and subcutaneous lesions; gallbladder surgery; haemorrhoids, anal fistulae and fissures; varicose veins; carpal tunnel; and ingrown toenails. Patients are seen in the Caulfield Consulting Clinics, and surgical procedures are performed at Sandringham Hospital.
