

What do I do on the day of my appointment?



- Come to Caulfield Hospital, 260 Kooyong Road, Caulfield
- **Parking** via Gate 2 on Kooyong Road. Cost \$6.00 per day
- **Tram 67** (stops Corner Kooyong & Glen Huntly Roads); 500 m walk
- **Tram 64** (stops Corner Hawthorn & Glen Huntly Roads); 500m walk
- **Bus 605**; stop Caulfield General Medical Centre
- Follow blue line from reception to lifts and go to Level 1, where you will see the reception desk

Our Geriatrician Service

We are doctors who specialize in the care and treatment of older people. We can help if you or your doctor are worried about any of the following:

- Problems with walking & falls
- Feeling tired
- Memory loss
- Feeling down or anxious
- Bladder / bowel problems
- Loss of strength
- Weight loss or diet concerns
- Ongoing health problems
- Pain
- Medications
- Driving
- Moving out of your home to live elsewhere

Who can attend?

There is no set age, but people are usually more than 75 years old.

Is there a cost?

It is a bulk-billing service with **no cost**.

What to expect:

- **Contact with the same doctor** each time you need to see a Geriatrician
- **A thorough assessment** of all of the problems you are worried about
- **A plan** to address these problems



Where can I or a family member see a Geriatrician?

Appointments are available at **Caulfield Hospital several days a week**.

Some patients may have an appointment via video call or in their residential care facility if unable to come to the clinic. Please discuss this with your Geriatrician.

How do I get an appointment?

Your GP can refer you. We will then send you appointment information in the mail, including date and time.



What do I bring to the appointment?



All current medications from your doctor and over the counter supplements



Recent results such as bloods tests, x-rays & scans



Completed form mailed to you with appointment date and time

We also encourage you to bring a family member or carer with you.
