

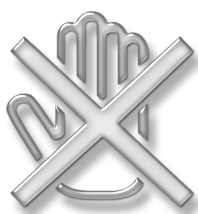
REFERRAL GUIDELINES: ORTHOPAEDICS - SANDRINGHAM HOSPITAL



Essential Referral Content

Exclusion Criteria

The following conditions are not routinely seen at Sandringham Specialist Consulting Clinics:

- Patients who are being treated for the same condition at another Victorian public hospital
- Surgical consultation for children under 18 years of age
- Patients who are at high anaesthetic risk
- Patients with BMI >40

Patients with a high anaesthetic risk may be referred to The Alfred for further management.

Sandringham Hospital offers a limited Orthopaedic service including surgery for:

- Shoulders
- Hip and Knees (including Total Hip and Knee replacements)
- Ankles and Feet

REFERRAL PROCESS: ORTHOPAEDICS - SANDRINGHAM HOSPITAL



STEP 1

You will be notified when your referral is received by outpatients. Essential referral content will be checked and you may be contacted for further information if required.



STEP 2

The referral is triaged by the specialist unit according to clinical urgency. This determines how long the patient will wait for an appointment.



STEP 3

Patients with **urgent** conditions are scheduled to be seen within 30 days. Patients with **routine** conditions are given the next available appointment according to clinical need. Both the referrer and patient are notified.
