Graduate Nurse Program (**General Nursing**)

The Graduate Nurse Program (GNP) at Alfred Health embodies our values in practice. Alfred Health is committed to providing support to new graduate nurses as they make the transition from undergraduate student to registered nurse.

PROGRAM AIM

The Alfred Health Graduate Nurse Program provides diverse clinical opportunities for graduates caring for varied populations within Alfred Health whilst working within a supportive nursing team. The GNP aims to support the new graduate during the period of adjustment in which the graduate develops the situational skills, knowledge and values required to become an effective member of the healthcare team and nursing workforce.

The program runs over 12 months, and all graduates complete two six month rotations. They are expected to work a rotating roster through all shifts based on local work environment shift patterns. The graduate year is offered on a part time basis, to give graduates work life balance, whilst continuing to support ongoing development needs. All graduates are employed in ongoing permanent nursing positions.

Clinical Support

Alfred Health offers clinical and structured support to all nurses in their Graduate Nurse Program.

PRECEPTOR

Graduate nurses are allocated a preceptor, who they will work alongside during supernumerary time. The preceptor provides clinical support, feedback, and assists with setting learning objectives.

CLINICAL SUPPORT NURSE

Clinical Support Nurses support graduate nurses throughout the entire 12 month program. They help with the transition to registered nurse, and ensure the delivery of safe patient care.

NURSE EDUCATORS

Nurse Educators are responsible for the professional development of nursing staff at Alfred Health. They are involved in the facilitation of study days for the Graduate Nurse Program.

CLINICAL SUPPORT & DEVELOPMENTNURSE

Clinical Support & Development Nurses contribute to the development of graduate nurses by providing specialty education about the patient population in their clinical areas.



Alfred Health Graduate Program Streams

Mental & Addiction Health

Alfred Mental and Addiction Health offer a 12 month structured program for graduate nurses who are keen to specialise in contemporary mental health nursing practice.

Graduate nurses are based primarily in inpatient settings but can expect to work across a number of clinical seatings including:

- Adult
- Aged
- Community residential (Community Care Unit)
- Residential eating disorders service

TRANSITION TO SPECIALTY PRACTICE (TSP) PROGRAM

After completion of the 12 month Graduate Nurse Program, you may choose to apply for a position in a TSP program. These are a structured 12 month program for Registered Nurses to provide a career pathway relevant to clinical specialty nursing practice. This program aligns with Registered Nurse at Grade 2, Year 2-3 level and offers an opportunity to build and consolidate knowledge and skills in comprehensive patient assessment in a specialty area through the development of critical thinking and problem solving.

POSTGRADUATE NURSING OPPORTUNITIES

APPLICATION PROCESS

Our recruitment process matches the Graduate Nursing Midwifery Program (GNMP) Postgraduate Medical Council of Victoria (PMCV) Allocation and Placement Service timeline and eligibility criteria.

All general Graduates at Alfred Health are recruited through PMCV match system.
