The Alfred is a major tertiary and quaternary referral hospital and is best known as one of Australia's busiest emergency and trauma centres. It is home to 17 state-wide services, including the Heart and Lung Transplant Service, Victorian Melanoma Service and Major Trauma Service, as well as the national Paediatric heart and Lung transplant service. We provide comprehensive care for the most complex patients. We also train the next generation of healthcare professionals through our education and learning programs, while working to discover breakthroughs in clinical care through translational research. The Alfred is home to the Alfred Research Alliance (A+)

Caulfield Hospital specialises in community services, rehabilitation, geriatric medicine and aged mental health. The hospital delivers many services through its outpatient and community-based programs. It plays a state-wide role in providing rehabilitation services, which includes the Acquired Brain Injury Rehabilitation Centre and the Transitional Living Service which works to further independence in patients before discharge. Providing care for people in their homes continues to be a key part of the site's work. Its 'Better at Home' program offers a diverse range of services outside of an inpatient environment and is aimed at avoiding or shortening the need for hospital admission.

Sandringham Hospital is community-focused, providing hospital healthcare needs for the local area through emergency, paediatrics, general medicine, general surgery, orthopaedics and outpatient services. The hospital works closely with the Royal Women's Hospital and local community healthcare providers. Alongside the hospital's Emergency Department, the Sandringham Ambulatory Care Centre (SACC) plays a vital role treating non-urgent patients, allowing our ED staff to care for higher-acuity patients. The Sandringham Community Bank[®] Day Procedure Centre continues to provide a modern, bright space for same-day surgery patients.

How to Apply for a Fellowship with Alfred Health

The Alfred Health Fellowship Program is a stepping stone to your future nursing employment at Alfred Health. You will be able to seek references from the Alfred Heath nursing leaders and expert clinicians for inclusion on your Graduate Nurse Application. The Fellowship Program may also lead to part-time work at as a RUSON at Alfred Health, which will further increase your familiarity with the organisation and facilitate your transition to the role of Graduate Nurse. Most importantly, being a part of the Alfred Fellowship Program guarantees an interview for the Alfred Health Graduate Nurse Program for applicants eligible for PMCV!

Entrance Criteria:

The Fellowship Program application process, closely mimics the application process to the Alfred Health Graduate Nurse Program. Understanding and participating in the Fellowship application process, will provide you an opportunity to initiate and then reflect upon the quality of your application.

Criteria are:

- Preregistration student undertaking your first qualification in Nursing at Deakin, La Trobe or Monash University (BN or MMP)
- A genuine interest in becoming a part of the Alfred Health nursing team
- A knowledge of an alignment of your values with our purpose and beliefs





Application process

Your university placement team will guide you on the application process & the questions you are required to respond to. This may be a written response or a short video. All the information you need to inform your decision is on our website. Make sure you know the specialities we offer & the sites that you could be placed on.





Frequently asked Questions

1. Can I be a Registered Undergraduate Nursing Student (RUSON) at Alfred Health as well as a member of the Fellowship Program?

Absolutely, we actively encourage you to be a RUSON at Alfred Health during your nursing degree. Participating in an Alfred Fellowship program will position you well to seek employment as a RUSON in part of our Nursing teams. RUSON positions are advertised on the Alfred Health job vacancy page

2. Are Mental Health, Intensive care, Emergency and Perioperative areas included as placement options in the Fellowship program?

Yes! Placements for Fellowship students occur in all specialist areas, at our three hospital campuses – The Alfred, Caulfield Hospital and Sandringham Hospital. As well as at numerous community-based clinics, who provide lifesaving treatments, specialist and rehabilitation services through to accessible local healthcare. We provide the most comprehensive range of adult specialist medical and surgical services in Victoria. We offer almost every form of medical treatment across our multiple sites and three hospital campuses. Alfred Health is a great place to begin your nursing career.

3. Can I apply if I am in international student?

Sure can! International students are encouraged to apply. However, as an International student you will not eligible for recruitment by the <u>Post Graduate Medical Council Victoria (PMCV: Computer match)</u> which is only available to domestic students. International applicants are eligible to apply for subsequent round graduate nurse (GNP) positions external to the PMCV system. Make sure you attend our graduate info events to find out more.

4. How many Fellowship position are available?

Like your future nursing career at Alfred Health, there are no limitations to our Fellowship Program. We want you to begin your nursing career with us and be a part of our amazing team. Placement capacity is limited each year to ensure the quality of placements is maintained, however priority is given to ensure all fellowship students are allocated each year.

5. Will I be able to apply for a GNP with Alfred health if I am unsuccessful in the Fellowship Program?

Yes, please apply! Alfred Health recruit on average 200 nursing graduates each year into their Graduate Nurse Program (GNP). Typically, we receive over 2000 applications each year for our GNP program. Fellowship students are given an interview (if eligible for PMCV) however it is not guarantee of a graduate position. We welcome GNP applications from all students.

6. If unsuccessful with the Fellowship Program, will I be able to still have placements at Alfred Heath?

Absolutely! You may still be placed at Alfred Health as part of your placement allocation. Your university placement team mange the allocations. We do however, give allocation preference to students on the Fellowship program.

7. Who can I talk to before I apply?

Your university will have a fellowship liaison person you can discuss your application with. Alfred Health Fellowship questions should be directed to the Alfred Health Preregistration coordinator, Sam Miller <u>undergraduate@alfred.org.au</u> Fellowship presentations occur at key times throughout the year, your university will advertise these. The presentations provide all the info you need and a time to ask specific questions.
